Course Description

Play is a hugely important but often overlooked requirement of education. Children learn how to adapt and problem solve through interactive play. Learners kindergarten-age and younger are still physically developing in areas that include proprioception and their vestibular systems. Active play enhances the development of these senses. Active play also has multiple health benefits for students and acts as an outlet for physical and psychological stress. The benefits of active play need to be available to all students. Traditional playground structures often ignore students who are unable to participate in activities that don't account for different human mobilities. The program is designed to help attendees understand different tactics for creating inclusive play for all stakeholders. Play elements extend beyond the structures created for playgrounds. Participants will learn how the ground surface can create limitless avenues for accessing the playground. During the presentation, they'll create scenarios for all children to participate in joint play vs parallel play.
